

Garden Gems of Cornwall, Devon & the Isles of Scilly 9th - 16th May 2024 (7 nights)









Join us on our tour of Cornwall and Devon, the charming and picturesque south-west corner of the British Isles. We visit private and world-famous gardens: Glendurgan, the Lost Gardens of Heligan and Hestercombe, and make a fabulous trip to the Isles of Scilly to visit Tresco Abbey Garden.

Thursday 9th May

We meet at London Paddington Train Station and take the mid-morning, scenic train journey to Cornwall. There will be time for lunch (independent) on the train. Our first visit is to the Lost Gardens of Heligan. The gardens were rediscovered 33 years ago and underwent a ground-breaking restoration project. In the late afternoon we check in to the 4-star Carbis Bay Hotel & Spa, St Ives. Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Friday 10th May

Today we begin with a visit to a wonderful private garden on the Lizard Peninsula. The gardens surround the elegant Georgian house and have been skilfully developed over the last 20 years. We meet the owner who will take us around the gardens, then we have lunch (included).

In the afternoon we visit a beautiful **private garden on an ancient Cornish estate**. We walk through the gardens with the delightful and characterful owner. We return to the hotel for dinner (included).

Saturday 11th May

We take a short flight to the Isles of Scilly, an outstandingly beautiful archipelago which lies just 35-miles off the coast of Cornwall. An inter-island boat transports us to Tresco island to visit the world-famous **Tresco Abbey Gardens** – a glorious 19th century sub-tropical garden, home to 20,000 plants from more than 80 countries. We have a tour of the gardens followed by lunch (independent). We return for dinner in the hotel (included).

NB: Flights (in small planes of approx. 15 seats) are subject to fair weather conditions. If travel is not possible, another garden visit will be substituted. If you prefer not to join the tour this day, please let us know at the time of booking and we may be able to adjust your tour price.

Sunday 12th May

This morning we visit **Glendurgan Garden**, a valley garden with outstanding spring displays of rhododendrons. We enjoy a tour with the owner followed by an exclusive lunch (included) in his home. We spend the afternoon in the pretty seaside town of **St Ives** where there is time to explore the shops, harbour and galleries. Tickets are included for **Tate St Ives** and **the Barbara Hepworth Museum & Sculpture Garden**. Your evening is at leisure (dinner independent).

Monday 13th May

After check out, we wend our way into Devon and visit The Garden House in Dartmoor National Park. The ten-acre garden was developed in the 1940s and is viewed as one of the finest in Britain. We enjoy a tour with the Head Gardener followed by lunch (included).

Wildside Garden is our next stop. This is the private garden of Keith Wiley, an inspiring proponent of the 'new naturalism' movement in gardening. We arrive in the late afternoon at the 5-star Bovey Castle Hotel to check in. Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Tuesday 14th May

This morning, enjoy **time at leisure** to use the hotel's facilities and amenities which include the indoor pool, spa, deer park, falconry, archery and over 275 acres of beautiful grounds to explore. There is time for lunch in the hotel (independent).

In the afternoon we make a visit to nearby Castle Drogo. Designed by Edwin Lutyens, it was the last castle to be built in England. We enjoy the superb gardens and castle before heading into the pretty Dartmoor town of Chagford for dinner (included).

Wednesday 15th May

Today we begin with a visit to **RHS Rosemoor**. Gifted to the Royal Horticultural Society by Lady Anne Berry in 1988, and known for its many garden 'rooms', RHS Rosemoor now spans 65 stunning acres. We enjoy a guided tour followed by free time for lunch (independent).

Later we visit a fascinating private garden, Plaz Metaxu. Developed over 30 years by an art historian, this thoughtprovoking garden is filled with classical references and vistas. We meet the owner for a walk through this wonderful garden. We return to the hotel for dinner (included).

Thursday 16th May

After check-out, we make a visit to Hestercombe Gardens. The formal Edwardian garden has been described as 'Lutyens at his best'. We have a tour of the gardens followed by a private lunch (included).

After lunch, we board the train at Taunton Station for the return journey to London Paddington Train Station where we expect to arrive in the late afternoon. From here, you can take the Heathrow Express train to the airport if needed.

The Carbis Bay Hotel & Spa, St Ives (4 nights)

This superb coastal retreat offers its own 25-acre beach, breathtaking views of Carbis Bay, individually designed bedrooms, award-winning dining and a luxurious spa with an outdoor heated pool. The 4-star hotel offers four restaurants and two bars, all with wonderful sea views. The coastal footpath passes alongside the hotel offering lovely coastal walks.

NB: This hotel does not have a lift due to the historic nature of the building and most rooms are accessed via a staircase.

Bovey Castle Dartmoor (3 nights)

Standing within 275 acres of beautiful countryside, 5-star Bovey Castle first opened as a hotel and golf resort in 1930. The 60 individually-designed bedrooms, both in the main manor house and the mews, offer luxurious surroundings with breathtaking views out across Dartmoor National Park. The hotel also has an indoor pool, sauna and spa.

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Great English Gardens with Chelsea Flower Show - Tour 1 17th - 24th May 2024 (7 nights)

Visit the world-famous Chelsea Flower Show on membersonly day, the Royal Horticultural Society's garden at Wisley, the Royal Botanic Gardens at Kew and the majestic Hampton Court Palace. We also spend four days in Kent, exploring some of England's most iconic gardens including Great Dixter, Sissinghurst Castle and Hever Castle.

Friday 17th May

We meet at the **Sheraton Heathrow Hotel** and depart midmorning. Our first visit is to Chartwell House, home of Sir Winston Churchill the British wartime Prime Minister. Chartwell is much more than just a fascinating house, it boasts an extensive garden with far-reaching views and Churchill's studio which is home to the largest collection of his paintings. Lunch (independent) at Chartwell. In the late afternoon we check in to the 4-star Spa Hotel, Royal Tunbridge Wells. Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Saturday 18th May

We begin the day with a pre-opening visit to **Sissinghurst** Castle Gardens, a romantic garden created around a slender brick-built castle tower. Its designer Vita Sackville-West's own words describe the garden perfectly: "Profusion, even extravagance and exuberance within the confines of the utmost linear severity".

After free time for lunch (independent), we head to **Pashley** Manor, an immaculate garden with emphasis on colour and form that surrounds a beautiful, timbered Tudor house with 18th century additions. We enjoy an introductory talk and time to explore the gardens. We stop at a traditional English **pub** for dinner on our return journey to the hotel (included).

Sunday 19th May

Our first visit today is a pre-opening guided tour of Great Dixter House and Garden, a cottage garden on a grand scale developed by the late Christopher Lloyd. The gardens are now superbly curated by internationally renowned gardener, Fergus Garrett. There is free time for lunch (independent).

We continue onto **Great Comp Garden**, an enormous achievement by two people who retired in 1957 from a busy London life. This is an informal garden set against a background of deciduous woodland. The gardens are now cared for by curator William Dyson, the UK's leading Salvia expert. Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Monday 20th May

This morning we take a pre-opening tour of **Hever Castle**. This picturesque, double-moated castle was the childhood home of

Anne Boleyn, second wife of King Henry VIII. The extensive grounds feature a 35-acre lake, fountains, and magnificent original Roman and Italian Renaissance statuary. Lunch is included at Hever Castle.

In the afternoon we are treated to an exclusive visit to the beautiful private gardens at Long Barn. This was the first home of Vita Sackville-West and Harold Nicolson where they 'served their gardening apprenticeship', before moving to Sissinghurst. We return to Tunbridge Wells where your evening is at leisure. (Dinner independent).

We have lunch (included) in the Tulip Room. In the afternoon we check in to the **4-star Foxhills Hotel**. Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Monday 20th May

We begin our day at **The Manor at Upton Grey** with its garden designed by Gertrude Jekyll in 1908. The current owner spent years researching the garden's history, then set about restoring it, and it is now considered to be the most complete and authentic Jekyll designed garden still in existence.

We continue to West Green Garden, one of England's finest manor house gardens created by acclaimed garden designer and Chelsea Flower Show award winner, Marylyn Abbott. We enjoy lunch in the gorgeous garden conservatory (included), time in the gardens and a floral demonstration. We return to the hotel where your evening is at leisure (dinner independent).

Tuesday 21st May

After checking out, we head to central London to enjoy the first members-only day at the RHS Chelsea Flower Show. Marvel at the magnificent floral displays by the best nurseries and specialist growers in the main pavilion. Be inspired by the extraordinary show gardens created by the leading lights in horticulture and enjoy the extensive array of gardening tools and gifts. There is time for lunch (independent).

Later, we travel to the Cotswolds and check in to the 4-star **Close Hotel in Tetbury.** Dinner is in the hotel (included).

Wednesday 22nd May

In the afternoon, we visit the Royal Gardens at Highgrove. This is the private home of His Majesty King Charles III and Queen Camilla. It is widely regarded as one of the most innovative gardens in the UK and is managed on the strictest sustainable and organic principles. We enjoy dinner at Highgrove (included).

Please note: Visits to Highgrove are limited and dependent on the King's diary. Dates are released in early spring each year, therefore it is not possible to guarantee a visit before this time. Our itinerary may be re-ordered to accommodate the visit, or an alternative garden will be included should a visit not be possible.

Thursday 23rd May

We begin the day with a pre-opening visit to **Iford Manor**, a Grade I Italianate garden designed by the architect and landscape gardener, Harold Peto. The manor house is also famed for its tranquil beauty and romantic setting. We will have a tour of the gardens with the owner.

We then drive through the historic **city of Bath** to a **privately** owned house, with award-winning gardens which were designed and developed by Julian and Isabel Bannerman over twenty years. The gardens are truly romantic and a rare treat. We will enjoy a light lunch (included) then take a stroll through the gardens before departure. We return to the hotel for dinner (included).

Friday 24th May

After a leisurely start, we visit the attractive market town of Cirencester with its Roman heritage and beautiful, 11th century church. There is time for you to explore independently and have lunch. In the afternoon we visit **Througham Court** Garden. This extraordinary private garden is inspired by scientific facts and theories, and the numbers and patterns found in nature. Afterwards, we continue on to Miserden Garden, a delightful Cotswolds garden that was designed, in part, by Edwin Lutyens. After meeting the owner and exploring the garden, we have a private dinner (included) in the Glasshouse Cafe.

Saturday 25th May

This morning we visit a **delightful private garden**, originally designed by Arne Maynard, with the picturesque River Avon at its heart. We enjoy a final lunch (included) in the garden. In the afternoon we drop off at the Sheraton Heathrow Hotel and Heathrow Airport Terminal 3 for inter-terminal transport links and the Heathrow Express train travel into London.





We pause, nearby, for a light lunch (included) in a restored chapel.

In the afternoon, we head south to a most picturesque farmhouse that is the home of the renowned garden designer Arne Maynard. We have a guided tour of his gardens at **Allt y Bela**. This spectacular high-season tour explores some of England's very best gardens in the delightful Cotswolds and in Kent – known as 'the Garden of England'. We never use more than two hotels during a one-week tour and often base 5-night tours at one beautiful hotel, chosen for its location, service and comfort.

What type of hotels do Sisley Garden Tours use?

We use 4 and 5-star hotels ranging from modern custom-built hotels to historic country houses. All our hotels are chosen for their excellent levels of comfort and service and their location, to minimise travel time to our tour destinations. Many hotels have leisure facilities and all bedrooms are en-suite. Most of our favourite hotels are located in beautiful historic buildings and for this reason, rooms are often different shapes and sizes and the layout of the hotel may be 'unusual'.

Not all hotels have air-conditioning or lifts to every floor. Access to your room may require a flight of stairs. Assistance with your luggage is provided. Please ask us if you would like more information on a specific hotel.

Do the rooms have bathtubs or Can special dietary restrictions be showers?

What kind of room should I book?

We do not 'match up' single travellers but if you are keen to find a room share, we will put you in touch with any other single travellers with the same request. Hotels charge per room which makes solo occupancy more expensive than sharing. All solo travellers are allocated a double room.

Can Sisley Garden Tours arrange additional nights' accommodation in the tour hotels at the start or end of the tour?

Yes, if rooms are available we will be happy to arrange extra nights for you. Please let us or your travel agent know at the time of your booking and we will confirm availability and prices. Where tours start at Heathrow Airport, many clients flying in long haul from overseas find it beneficial to fly in the day before and stay at an airport hotel so that they are fully rested for the tour start.

accommodated?

We will do our best to accommodate dietary restrictions and allergies, but you must ensure that they are made clear to us at the time of booking so we can share the information with the hotels and restaurants.

Is it necessary to have a good level of mobility?

Our aim is for every client to fully enjoy our tours. In order to achieve this, you do need to be fit enough to participate fully. Please bear in mind

that you will have to climb steps to get on and off the coach several times per day, walk around large gardens, manage stairs in the hotels and showers over the bath. If you have any queries as to whether our tours are suitable for you, please check with us.

I have some health problems, and want to know if this will be an issue?

If your health problem is minor and you can self-manage it without extra care or special facilities, then we should be able to accommodate you. While our primary aim as tour directors is to look after all our clients' needs, we must ensure that the particular needs of individuals do not adversely affect the experience of other group members.

How much walking is involved on

The nature of the gardens and towns we visit means there is a reasonable amount of walking and standing involved in our daily itineraries. Where guided tours of gardens are included as part of our visit, clients may always opt out to rest and where we visit historic towns and villages, the amount of walking and independent exploration is up to the client. Should clients wish to take a day off from the tour, they are perfectly welcome to do so as long as we are returning to the same hotel in the evening. If you have a mobility problem or concern, you may not find our tours suitable. Please contact us if you have any doubts.

Are airport transfers included in the tour price?

Unless the tour itinerary specifically states that the tour starts at the airport, transfers are not included. See individual itineraries for tour ending points. We can assist with arrival or departure planning.

What is the dress code?

Day wear is informal and we would recommend layers for variable temperatures, a waterproof jacket and appropriate footwear. In the evening we suggest 'smart casual'. Gentlemen are not required to wear a jacket or tie.

Garden Tour?

Days can sometimes be fairly long, but we aim to take things at a relaxed pace and build in time for relaxation in the day. We might typically leave at 9 am and arrive back at our hotel at 5 pm, however, some days may be longer and others shorter depending on the day's itinerary.

What sort of vehicle do we travel in?

Sisley Garden Tours has a number of established partnerships with professional coach operators who provide both a professional driver and deluxe midi-coach for our tours, in addition to the services of your Sisley tour director. We like to use local companies with excellent local knowledge and the coaches we use are chosen for their comfort and sized appropriately for the tour group. Our coaches benefit from air conditioning and PA system.

How much driving do we do?

We design tours so that there is as little wasted time as possible on the coach and plenty to see while aboard. Inevitably, there are days when travelling between locations may involve motorway driving and more mileage. We do travel along scenic routes wherever possible and you will see more of the countryside and local village life than on a regular tour.

Am I expected to leave gratuities?

All tour gratuities are included in the price including tour director, coach driver and hotel tips. However, if during the tour you visit a café or restaurant independently or have used a taxi, it is common to leave a small gratuity (typically 10%) if you have received good service.

What meals are included?

Delicious breakfasts, lunch and/or dinner are included daily (see tour itinerary for details of meal inclusions). One thing to remember, dinner times in the UK are usually from 7pm.

Do you include entrance fees to attractions?

All entries to the gardens and flower shows set out in the tour itinerary are included in the price. In addition, we include entrance fees to historic houses that form part of our itinerary when they are open to the public and a number of garden talks/ tours by head gardeners and garden owners.

What is a typical day on a Sisley What is not included in a Sisley Is my deposit refundable if I cannot garden tour?

Air fares (except where included in the itinerary); drinks; items of a personal nature; entrance fees when not included in our tour itinerary; guide books and other literature for sale at the gardens we visit; incidental expenses such as telephone bills, newspapers, laundry and room service incurred at the hotels is the responsibility of the individual client. All expenses are to be settled at check-out.

Will I need a visa?

Tour Price Excludes: Airfares; transfers (unless otherwise stated in the itinerary); passport fees where applicable; lunches and dinners (unless otherwise stated in the tour itinerary); beverages; laundry; telephone calls; souvenirs and items of a personal nature.

Payment: Payment is due in two parts; The deposit secures your place on the tour at the time of booking. Final payment is required 120 days before the tour commencement date. Payments are non-transferable.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellation by the client: More than 120 days prior to departure - loss of deposit; between 119 days and 60 days - loss of 50% of tour cost; 59 days and less before departure - 100% cancellation penalty.
